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

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Overview

- Purpose: To compare Tennessee's reported outcomes on living situation and employment to other southeastern states and the United States.
- Data sources:
 - Multi-state data comes from the FY2012 and FY2013 Uniform Reporting Systems (URS) tables.
 - Tennessee data is collected by the internal and external sources listed below:
 - Behavioral Health Safety Net
 - Avatar
 - Private psychiatric hospital data
 - TennCare
- Population: Anyone receiving a behavioral health service.
- Compared states contiguous with Tennessee.
- Methodologies by which other states collect data are unknown.


The Tennessee rate was higher than other southern states and the U.S. rate in both FY2012 and FY2013 for living situation: Private residence.

Figure 1. Living situation FY2012 and FY2013: Private residence




Tennessee was below the U.S. rate in both FY2012 and FY2013 for living situation: Homeless/Shelter.

Tennessee was ranked third in both fiscal years for individuals whose living situation was jail/correctional facility. In FY2013, TN was below the U.S. rate.

Tennessee had a higher rate of employed people receiving mental health services compared to most other southern states and the U.S. in FY2012 and FY2013.
