

Tennessee Family Violence Prevention and Services Act (FVPSA) Grants Statistics Summary

FY2012 / FY2013 / FY2014

FVPSA grants provide immediate shelter and supportive services to victims of family violence, domestic violence, and dating violence for adults and youth, as well as their dependents. All shelter programs must provide the following nine core components: safe confidential shelter; 24 hour crisis hotline; counseling; advocacy; transportation; community education; referral; follow-up; and specialized services to children.

Every shelter program that receives FVPSA funding must annually report 100% of the residential and non-residential clients served by the shelter program and report on the services received by those clients.

Through an annual, federal FVPSA Formula Grant and state funding, Tennessee awards grants to 30 domestic violence shelter programs.









Clients Served



A combined average of 566 shelter beds were available (each year) in FY 2011, FY 2012, and FY2013.


Domestic Violence Non-Residential Services



Supportive Services to Domestic Violence Victims



Individual Supportive Services include crisis intervention, safety planning, individual counseling, educational services, legal advocacy, personal advocacy, housing advocacy, information/referral, transportation, and follow-up.

Group Supportive Services include victims' support group, group counseling sessions or group educational sessions covering a variety of topics.



Individual Supportive Services for Children and Youth include crisis intervention, safety planning, individual counseling, peer counseling, educational services, and court advocacy.

Group Supportive Services for Children and Youth includes group counseling.
