




# 2016 Post-Graduation Migration Study

from the Tennessee Higher Education Commission

In 2011 and 2012, **56,325** undergraduate students graduated from Tennessee's public universities and community colleges.



## Migration After Graduation



Students that graduate from Tennessee's public universities and community colleges, especially in-state students, stay in the state at high rates after graduation to work and further their studies.
