



# Tigrett WMA

# TIGRETT WMA BLIND SUMMARY



Tigrett Wildlife Management Area is a 7,000-acre wetland that is predominantly ponded and consists of cypress, water tupelo and button bush. Very little food is available for waterfowl on Tigrett WMA. However, during abnormally dry summer and early fall months, water levels drop below normal pool making conditions favorable for moist soil grasses.

Tigrett WMA is open with statewide waterfowl seasons. Most of Tigrett is only open to temporary hunting. However,

there are currently 17 permanent, draw blind sites on Tigrett. There are two, main river access sites. The east access is located at the end of Old Hwy 104, near the Dyer/Gibson County line, and the west access is located at the south end of Parker Ditch Road.

The letter of the blind site denotes the access point on the Forked Deer River levee. The number denotes the number of the blind site at that access.

**Blind A1 (N36 00.262' W089 12.764')**: This blind site is located in a permanently ponded cypress, water tupelo area. It is approximately 300 yards from the main river levee with relatively easy access. The blind will accommodate approximately six hunters.

**Blind A2 (N36 00.135' W089 12.751')**: This blind site is located in the same general location as A1 and approximately 200 yards south. The blind will accommodate approximately six hunters.

**Blind A3 (N36 0.501' W89 12.287')**: Accessed from the Middle Fork of the Forked Deer River. The hunters should use the ramp at old 104 access on the North Fork. A second boat is needed to pull over the levee to access the blind.

**Blind B1 (N36 00.397' W089 13.194')**: This blind site is located only 75 yards off the river levee. During normal years, hunter can wade from the main levee to this blind. The blind will accommodate four or five hunters.

**Blind C1 (N36 00.309' W089 13.437')**: This blind site is located approximately 100 yards from the river levee. During low water, hunters can wade into this site from the river levee. However, during normal pool a second small boat is needed. This site is situated in a small pothole surrounded by button bushes.

**Blind D1 (N35 59.963' W089 13.434')**: This site is located approximately 600 yards from the main river levee or one-half mile from Greenhill Bottom Boat Access. The site is relatively difficult to access in low water conditions.

**Blind D2 (N36 00.033' W089 13.385')**: This site is located 200 yards northeast of D1. Access to D2 is through D1 and is subject to the same limitations.

**Blind E1 (N35 59.807' W089 14.407')**: This blind site is approximately 100 yards off the river levee and is located in a large open pothole. With a second boat it is relatively easy to access. There is a large floating blind at the site.

**Blind F1 (N35 59.669' W089 14.452')**: This blind site is located approximately 300 yards from the river levee. During summer and fall, this site is extremely difficult to access due to heavy concentrations of smartweed and shallow water. During normal pool for winter months, the site can be accessed with a small boat. In most years, access is not feasible until mid-December. There is no blind at this site.

**Blind F2 (N35 59.537' W089 14.489')**: This blind site is located approximately 300 yards southwest of site F1. Access to F2 is through F1 site and is subject to the same limitations. This four- or five-man floating blind is situated in a small open pothole.

**Blind G1 (N35 59.677' W089 14.770')**: This blind site is located about 100 yards from the river levee. It is located on an old creek meander that is normally five or six feet deep. The floating blind will accommodate approximately four hunters.

**Blind H1 (N35 59.495' W089 15.299')**: This blind site is located approximately 100 yards from the river levee. During normal pool a small boat will have to be carried from the river levee approximately 50 yards to the waters edge. The blind site is located 50 yards from land. The blind is a large six- to eight-man structure situated in a large open pothole.

**Blind H2 (N35 59.346' W089 15.159')**: This blind site is located 400 to 500 yards south of site H1 and is accessed through H1 site. This site is in shallower water than H1 with a large concentration of smartweed surrounding the pothole. The blind is a small four- to five-man stationary structure.

**Blind H3 (N35 59.480' W089 15.122')**: This blind site is accessed from H1 site and is located approximately 300 yards southeast of H1. This site is a small pothole surrounded by button bushes and willows. The blind is an old six-man structure. As in site H1 and H2, a small boat is needed to access this site.

**Blind I1 (N35 59.756' W089 15.043')**: This blind site is located on the north side of the Forked Deer River. The site is situated just down river from F access. The blind is approximately 75 yards north of the river levee and requires a small boat on the backside of the levee. During high water, this site may be accessed from the Rollen Access Ramp. The blind is an old six-man structure.

**Blind J1 (N35 58.960' W089 17.300')**: This site is on the north side of the Forked Deer River, one-half mile down stream from the Parker Ditch Boat Access. The blind site is located approximately 150 yards from the river in a large open slough surrounded by cypress and water tupelo. Access is moderately difficult during normal pool due to the slough being 75 yards from the river and a large concentration of smartweed in front of the blind. The blind is an old four-man structure.

**Blind J2 (N35 59.157' W089 17.309')**: This blind site is located approximately 300 yards north of site J1. The blind is situated in a small open area surrounded by cypress and water tupelo. The blind is an old six-man structure. Access can be obtained by a small boat and motor during normal winter pool but is extremely difficult in late fall and early winter.

**Blind J3 (N35 59.001' W089 17.165')**: This blind site is located 250 yards east of site J1. Access to the slough is 200 yards east of the J1 slough access. The site is a small pothole surrounded by button bushes. There is no blind at this site.
