

2022-23 State Report Card Frequently Asked Questions

GENERAL REPORT CARD QUESTIONS:

What is the State Report Card?

The State Report Card is an important tool for families, educators, elected officials, education stakeholders, and communities to understand how Tennessee's schools are serving all students—and how they can improve to accelerate student achievement. With this knowledge, we can continue to build on our state's progress to ensure every Tennessee student has the opportunity for success.

What will be included in the 2022-23 State Report Card?

The 2022-23 State Report Card includes a dashboard of detailed school and district data, including student letter grades, student performance, growth, attendance, discipline, finances, staff information, English learners' proficiency in English, graduation rate, and postsecondary readiness. What new features are included in the 2022-23 State Report Card?

For the first time, the State Report Card will include School Letter Grades and a 2023-24 TISA Calculator. Families can use a calculator tool to demonstrate how the new state funding formula is designed to address individual student needs. The School Letter Grades were originally released on a dashboard within the State Report Card website, but now families can view those letter grades within individual school-level pages in the 2022-23 State Report Card.

Will files still be available for download via the Data Downloads page?

Some metrics appear to have no information or say "Suppressed" for my school or district. Why is this information missing?

In accordance with federal and state law and policy, the department is required to suppress any information that may be personally identifiable for students. As a result, some metrics are not viewable. This is indicated by messages such as "Suppressed", "<30 students", or "<5%" on the report card. SCHOOL LETTER GRADES:

What is the School Letter Grades Rating System?

In 2016, the Tennessee legislature passed a law requiring the Tennessee Department of Education (the department) to create a rating system that annually assigns schools with an A-F letter grade to help the public easily understand how our schools are doing. Due to implementation delays including testing administration issues and the COVID-19 pandemic, Tennessee has assigned letter grades to schools for the first time this year.

Where can I find school letter grades?

School letter grade information will be available on the 2022-23 Report Card, located on school-level pages under the "Performance Metrics" tab.

How are School Letter grades determined?

There are several factors that determine school letter grades. These include Student Achievement and Academic Growth measures for all schools, as well as a measure of College and Career Readiness just for high schools.

- **Student Achievement** is an indicator of how well all the students in your school know the skills required for their grade level as measured by the state TCAP test.
- Student Academic Growth is an indicator of how well the students in your school are doing, compared to their peers across the state.

The letter grade includes two measures for growth:

- The first academic growth score is for the growth of all students.
- 2 The second measures the growth of the school's highest need students—those who rank in the school's bottom 25% of students based on achievement— which emphasizes the need for schools to focus on supporting these students.
- College and Career Readiness is included only for letter grades for high schools and is based on how many graduating students succeed on measures like the ACT, college credit exams or opportunities, industry credentials, and military readiness.

What was the distribution of letter grades across the state?

Out of the around 1,900 public K-12 schools across the state, around 1,700 of the schools were eligible for letter grades. Here is the distribution of letter grades across the state:



Note: An additional 210 schools did not receive a letter grade due to ineligibility. Find out more about our eligibility rules for letter grades <u>here</u>.

Where can I find more information on how letter grades are calculated?

The department sought input on letter grade calculations from stakeholders and members of the public through a variety of engagement opportunities, including small group conversations, local town halls, social media and written public comments. Through this process, the department created a letter grade calculation that includes Achievement, Growth, Growth for Highest Need Students, and College and Career Readiness (CCR) for high school students. TISA:

How does finance reporting differ this year under the Tennessee Investment in Student Achievement Act (TISA)?

In previous years, the State Report Card showed annual BEP expenditures. With the adoption of the Tennessee Investment in Student Achievement Act (TISA), this year, the State Report Card also provides 2023-24 TISA allocations for the state and each district and school.

The TISA allocations at the school level are shown by a TISA calculator, a tool designed to estimate how much funding individual students generate under the TISA funding formula. To determine an estimated allocation for an individual student in a school, users can respond to the questions on the left side of the tool based on individual student needs and the calculator on the right side will adjust accordingly. The TISA Calculator is held under the "About this School" and "Finance" tabs.
