

# **Unique Learning Needs**

- A Unique Learning Need (ULN) is a learning need for which an LEA must provide the student individualized services, interventions, accommodations, or modifications to meet the student's needs
- ULNs are tied to needed academic supports for students and each includes:
  - An **assessment** for identification
  - A **service plan** of supports



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# ULNs in TISA Law & Rule

#### <u>TISA Law</u>

- ULNs are divided into 10 categories ranging from ULN 1 through ULN 10, aligned to higher levels of support necessary to meet the student's unique learning needs.
- Each ULN has a weight percentage assigned to correspond to services needed.
- The ULN's weight is multiplied by the base funding amount to generate additional funds for students.

## **ULNs in TISA Law & Rule**

### TISA Rule

- Defines which types of student subgroups will be covered in the ULNs
- Places each student subgroup into ULNs based on need, differentiating within subgroups where applicable

### **Student Subgroups**

- Students with Disabilities
- English Learners
- Students with Characteristics of Dyslexia



## **Students with Disabilities**

#### **ASSESSMENT:**

Initial Evaluation and Annual Reevaluation

#### PLAN: Individualized Education Program (IEP)

- IEPs capture services and hours needed to support the student's instructional needs as determined by the IEP team
- Services and hours are translated into special education option codes in the state system
- A student may generate both a primary and secondary option code, if applicable
- Option codes are then assigned into specific ULNs TISA Rule

### **Students with Disabilities**

| Special<br>Education<br>Option Code | Services / Hours Descriptions  | Unique Learning<br>Need Assignment |
|-------------------------------------|--|------------------------------------|
| Option 1                            | Consultation - Minimum of 2 contacts/month, except OT/PT (minimum of 3 contacts/year). Time must be reported.<br>Direct Services equal to or less than 1 hour/week. Related Services equal less than 1 hour/week.  | ULN 1                              |
| Option 2                            | Direct Services more than or equal to 1, but less than 4 hours/week; or any one Related Service more than or equal to 1, but less than 4 hours/week.   | ULN 2                              |
| Option 3                            | Direct Services more than or equal to 4, but less than 9 hours/week; or any one Related Service more than or equal to 4, but less than 9 hours/week.   | ULN 3                              |
| Option 4                            | Direct Services more than or equal to 9, but less than 14 hours/week; or any one Related Service more than or equal to 9, but less than 14 hours/week.   | ULN 6                              |
| Option 5                            | Direct Services more than or equal to 14, but less than 23 hours/week; or any one Related Service more than or equal to 14, but less than 23 hours/week.   | ULN 7                              |
| Option 6                            | Ancillary Services - Attendant provided so that the student can have at least 4 hours/day in less restrictive and general education settings.  | ULN 8                              |
| Option 7                            | Direct Services - Special Education services 23 or more hours/week; or, any one Related Service 23 or more hours/week.   | ULN 9                              |
| Option 8                            | <ul> <li>Self-Contained or CDC - The sum of all direct services plus related services listed below plus up to 10 hours/week of special education educational assistant in the general program equals 32.5 or more hours/ week. In addition, at least two Related Services from those specified below must be received for at least the minimum times listed.</li> <li>•1 Hour/Week: Psychological Services, Counseling Services, Speech/Language Services, Vision Services, Hearing Services</li> <li>•3 contacts/year, with time span reported: Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy</li> </ul> | ULN 9                              |
| Option 9                            | Residential Services - Provided 24 hours/day.  | ULN 10                             |
| Option 10                           | Hospital/Homebound - Provided 3 or more hours/week.  | ULN 10                             |



## **English Learners**

**ASSESSMENT:** 

Home Language, Entry Screener, WIDA

**PLAN:** Individual Learning Plan (ILP)

#### Data Used to Inform TISA

- English Learner status
  - Receiving direct services
  - Receiving indirect services
  - Transition Year 1 or 2
- Number of years receiving English Learner (EL) services
- WIDA scores

# **English Learners**

#### **TIER 1:** English Learners

- Transition Year 1 or 2 students OR
- Students receiving indirect services OR
- Long-term English learners (7+ years of ESL services)

#### **TIER 2:** English Learners

- Receives direct ESL services AND
- Meets one of the following
  - Has received ESL services for 4+ years OR
  - WIDA score above 3

#### **TIER 3:** English Learners

- Receives direct ESL services AND
- Has received ESL services for a maximum of 3 years AND
- WIDA score of 3 or lower

| EL Tier   | Assigned ULN |
|-----------|--------------|
| EL Tier 1 | ULN 2        |
| EL Tier 2 | ULN 4        |
| EL Tier 3 | ULN 5        |



### **Students with Characteristics of Dyslexia**

#### **ASSESSMENT:**

Composite on universal reading screener or an LEA's Early Warning System, **and** deficiencies in 50% or more of the grade-appropriate subtests

**PLAN:** ILP – Characteristics of Dyslexia (ILP-D)

- Characteristics of dyslexia is an identification of a unique set of reading challenges and is not synonymous with a specific learning disability in reading.
- Students whose parent/guardian decline an ILP-D or a student who has an IEP to support deficiencies in basic reading, reading fluency, or reading comprehension do not qualify for Characteristics of Dyslexia ULN
- All students with active ILP-Ds are assigned to ULN 2
- All districts will receive Characteristics of Dyslexia ULN counts aligned to 5% of their base average daily membership (ADM) in the first year of TISA implementation



## **Average Daily Membership**

- Once a student has been categorized into a ULN, the student's average daily membership (ADM) for the year will be used to multiply by the designated ULN weight and base funding amount
- ADM values start from the date a student's service plan is in place until it is no longer assigned
- If a student's status changes during the year, the ULN assignment and ADM data will shift as well

#### EXAMPLE

At the beginning of the year, Student A's initial IEP places the student as a ULN 2, but exactly midway through the year Student A has their annual IEP meeting. The IEP is updated and now generates ULN 3. Student A will generate funding for ULN 2 for half of the year and then generate ULN 3 funding for the period of the year following the IEP update.



# **ULN Funding**

Funding through ULNs is determined by: (ULN ADM Value) x (ULN Weight %) x (TISA Base Funding Amount) = (ULN Funding)

Example: Student A is assigned special education option code 3 during annual IEP meeting halfway through the year

- ULN ADM Value: **.5** representing assignment to the ULN for half of the year
- ULN Weight: Option Code 3 is assigned to ULN 3 which has a weight of 40%
- TISA Base Funding: **\$6,860** for 2023-24

.5 x 40% x \$6,860 = \$1,372





## **ULN Funding**

- Students may generate up to four ULNs:
  - Two for special education services (primary and secondary option codes)
  - One for English Learner Tier
  - One for Characteristics of Dyslexia
- Students may generate the same ULN more than once





## Monitoring

- All student subgroups are monitored for compliance with state and federal regulations
- Monitoring protocols review the identification, plans, and services for student subgroups
- State monitors for variations in identification rates and quality of service plans






# **Putting It All Together**

ULNs are part of the weights in the TISA funding formula and provide additional resources to support student needs.

| Unique<br>Learning<br>Need | Weight | ULN Descriptions  |
|----------------------------|--------|---|
| ULN 1                      | 15%    | Special Education Option 1  |
| ULN 2                      | 20%    | <ul> <li>Special Education Option 2</li> <li>English Learner Tier I</li> <li>Characteristics of Dyslexia</li> </ul> |
| ULN 3                      | 40%    | Special Education Option 3  |
| ULN 4                      | 60%    | English Learner Tier II   |
| ULN 5                      | 70%    | English Learner Tier III  |
| ULN 6                      | 75%    | Special Education Option 4  |
| ULN 7                      | 80%    | Special Education Option 5  |
| ULN 8                      | 100%   | Special Education Option 6  |
| ULN 9                      | 125%   | <ul><li>Special Education Option 7</li><li>Special Education Option 8</li></ul>                                     |
| ULN 10                     | 150%   | <ul><li>Special Education Option 9</li><li>Special Education Option 10</li></ul>                                    |


#### Weights
