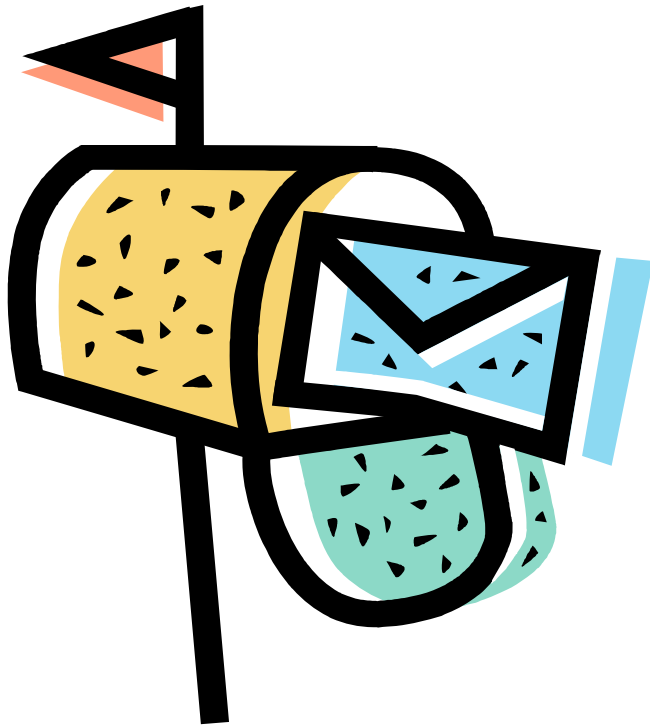

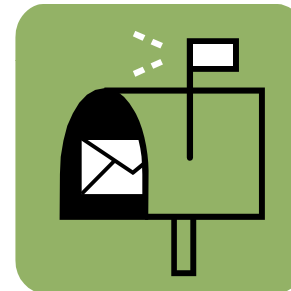

# How should these notifications be distributed?

- District and School Websites
- Letters Home
- Local Newspaper
- School Newsletters
- Title I Brochures
- District and School Meetings
- Student Handbooks
- Media

*\*Note: Some notifications have specific guidelines about distribution.*



# Report Card on Statewide Academic Assessment

Each year school districts that receive Title I funds must prepare and distribute to parents an annual district report card.



# Teacher Qualifications

Parents have the right to request information about the professional qualifications of their child's classroom teacher.

# Title I Requirement

A Title I school must give timely notice that the parent's child has been taught for **4 or more consecutive weeks** by a teacher who is not highly qualified.

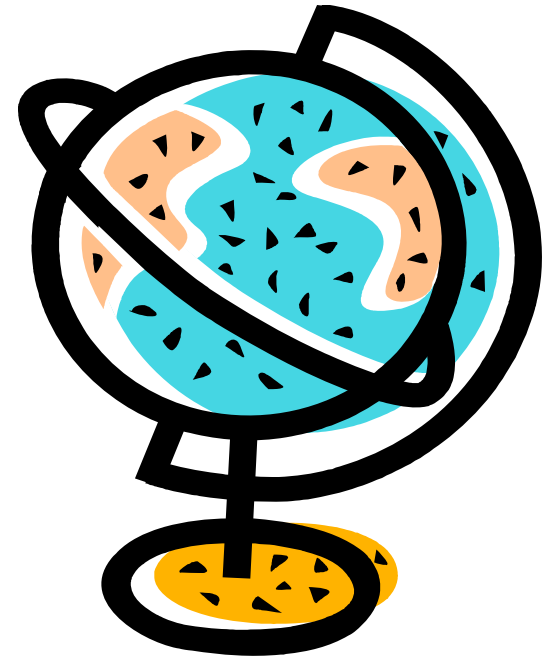

# Limited English Proficient Programs

School district that uses federal funds to provide a language instruction educational program for children with limited English proficiency must **notify parents of their child's eligibility for ESL services and their rights.**



# Schools Identified for **Improvement, Corrective Action, or Restructuring**

## The school district must:

- Notify Parents
- Explain Identification
- Give Reason for Identification
- Explain What School is Doing to Change
- Explain How District and State will Help
- Explain How Parents Can Become Involved
- Explain Options for Student



# Supplemental Educational Services

When a school fails to make Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) according to certain statutory timetables, the district must make supplemental educational services available to eligible students in the school.

## Parent notification:

- Annual Notice of Services
- List of Approved Providers
- Brief Description of Services
- Qualifications and Effectiveness of each Provider



# National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP)

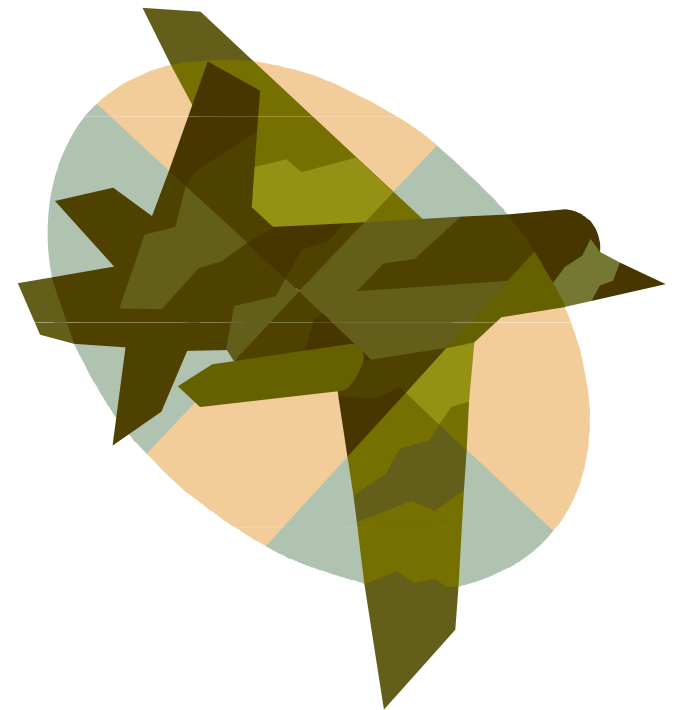
Parents must be informed if their child has been **selected** to participate in any NAEP assessment.

# Military Recruiter Access to Student Information

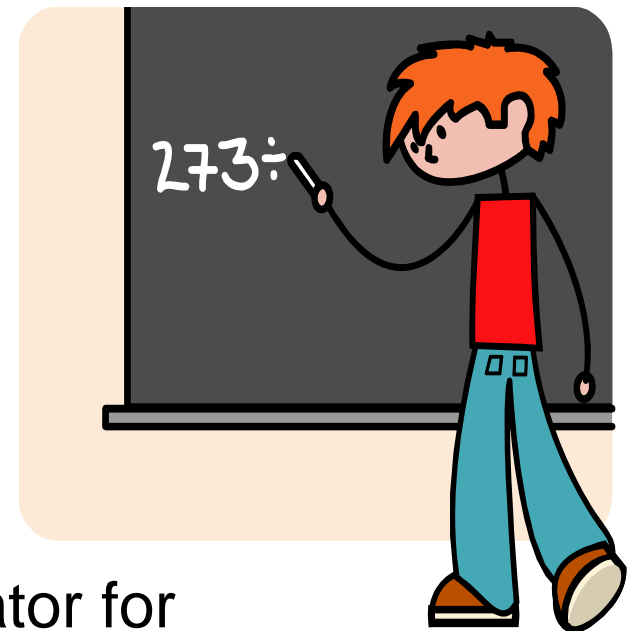
Parents of secondary school students must be notified of their right to restrict their child's name, address and telephone number from being released to military recruiters without prior permission.



# Homeless Children

Parents of homeless children must be give written notification of their child's rights regarding their education.

- Transportation
- Educational Services
- Choice of School
- Meals
- Local Liaison and the State Coordinator for Homeless Children contacts



# Student Privacy

Districts must give parents annual notice, at the beginning of the school year, about policies regarding student privacy and a parent's right to inspect:

- Third Party Surveys before Distribution
- Sensitive Information Surveys
- Instructional Materials
- Administration of Physical Exams or Screening of Students
- Personal Information for the Purpose of Marketing or Selling



# Waiver Request

If a school district requests the U.S Secretary of Education to waive any provision or regulation of NCLB, they must provide notice and inform the public.



# 21<sup>st</sup> Century Community Learning Center

A program or activity funded as part of the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Learning Center provides **before and after school activities** to advance student academic achievement.



# Schoolwide Programs

- A district must inform eligible schools and their parents of the schoolwide program under which eligible schools may consolidate their funds to upgrade the educational program of the school.
