

# Fall Creek Falls Campground

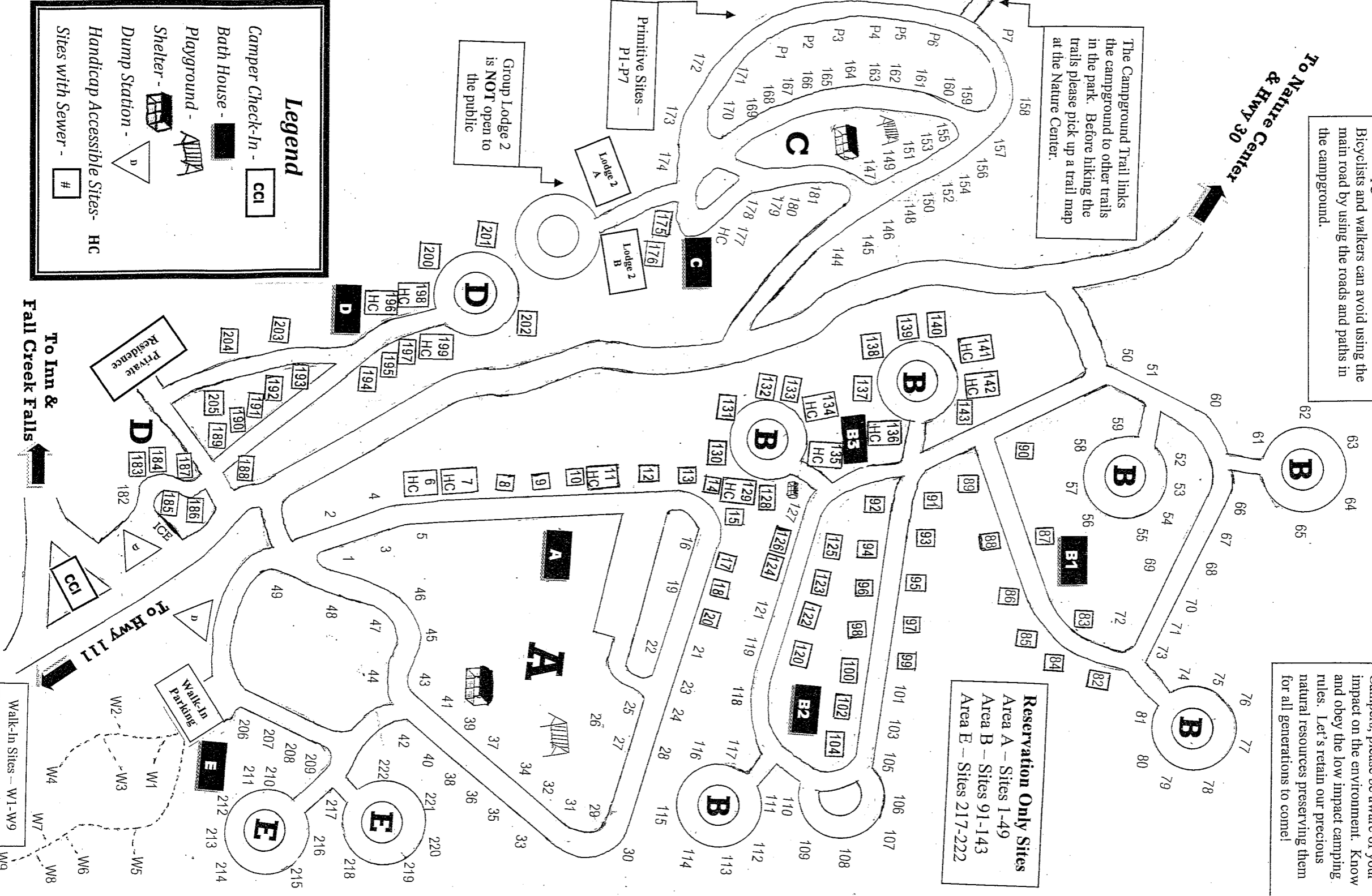
The campground road sees a lot of traffic. Bicyclists and walkers can avoid using the main road by using the roads and paths in the campground.

## Fall Creek Falls Campground Rules

Before registering for a campsite the camper must have a non-movable piece of property on the campsite or have a reservation. A non-movable piece of property means a tent that is set up and staked into the ground, a trailer, a motor home, a vehicle or a person. If a 1<sup>st</sup> come 1<sup>st</sup> serve site does not have a non-movable piece of property on it that means the site is available to anyone who puts a non-movable piece of property up first. Paying for a 1<sup>st</sup> come 1<sup>st</sup> serve site does not hold the site without properly claiming the site first. Movable property such as coolers, chairs, ropes, and tablecloths will not hold the site. Movable property put on sites in order to hold the site will be removed from the site by park staff and the site will be available for rent.

No more than 8 people are allowed to be registered for each site. This includes children.

A campsite may contain only one (1) camping unit (motor home, pop-up, trailer, etc...). Up to two (2) tents along with the unit are allowed depending on the space available at a particular campsite. If tent camping, up to three (3) tents are allowed, but no more than 8 people.

Any site that has been properly claimed (see above) must then be paid for at camper check-in and a date marker posted on the site # post at the campsite. If a date marker is not present park staff will stop and ask about the camper's registration progress.

Check Out time is 12:00pm (Central Time Zone). All campers should vacate the campsite by 12:00pm or re-register for another night by 12:00pm. The campsite should be left in clean condition. Failure to properly clean up after a stay will be considered littering and a citation will be issued. The campfire should be totally extinguished before vacating the campsite as well. Do Not burn trash in the fire ring. Cutting of trees or any vegetation is prohibited and violators will be fined.

### Camping Rates

Water & Electric Site	\$20.00
Water, Electric & Sewer Site	\$25.00
Primitive Sites in Campground C	\$11.00
Walk-In Sites	\$8.00

The above rates allow for up to 4 people. A fee of \$1.00 per person over 4 people will be charged for extra campers over the age of 7. Children under the age of 7 will not be charged the extra fee. Again a maximum of 8 people are allowed per site. Discounts are available for state employees, retired state employees, disabled persons, Tennessee senior citizens, Tennessee National Guard members, Tennessee veterans (off-season only), active duty military, public school teachers, state university and community college employees, and current members of the Tennessee General Assembly. Proper identification will be necessary to receive a discount. The discounts vary from season to season and are not the same percent off year round nor are all discounts the same.
