**Chief Paul Glowacki:** Chief Glowacki has been the Chief of Police at St. Mary's University in San Antonio, Texas for eight years, after working 18 years as the Assistant Chief of the Campus Safety Department at Trinity University and Lieutenant for the Department of Public Safety at Marquette University. He graduated from session 211 of the FBI National Academy. In 2005, he was the recipient of the Bill G. Daniels Outstanding Administrators Award from the Texas Association of College and University Police Administrators.

**Chief Noel March:** Chief March is the Director of Public Safety for The University of Maine where he is responsible for a community-policing agency of 35 employees providing full service police, security, communications, parking & transportation services. He is a subject matter expert for the COPS Office of the U.S. Department of Justice on the topic of community oriented policing. Chief March has been featured in *University Business* magazine, *Police Chief* magazine, *FBI National Academy Associates* magazine, *Campus Law Enforcement Journal* magazine and *Law Enforcement Trainer* magazine. A decorated veteran of law enforcement in Connecticut and Maine, he has held the ranks of Patrol Officer, Drug Unit Supervisor, Chief Deputy Sheriff and, in addition, he was a member of the 2002 Winter Olympics Police Force in Salt Lake City, Utah. In 1998, Mr. March became the founding Director of the Maine Community Policing Institute, and in 2007 he was named Chairman of the Board of Trustees for the LifeFlight of Maine Foundation.
