# Cross-Streaming

## *What is Cross-Streaming?*

Cross-streaming is collaboration among the three streams of national service: **AmeriCorps, Senior Corps** and **Learn and Serve America**. This practice is supported by the **Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS)** to better achieve program goals through effective communication, teamwork, and one unified cause of promoting service and volunteerism across National Service programs.

## *Why Cross-Streaming is Important?*

Cross-streaming allows for more flexibility in programs, facilitates access between programs, and ultimately creates a communication web between all programs. More **communication** between programs doesn't necessarily mean doing service projects together every week, it just simply means **referencing volunteers** to their right "fit" and building relationships between programs. Networking is a very important aspect of forming connections. These connections could help programs' **recruitment** rates and allow for **cutting costs** by cross-streaming on activities and service projects. The idea is to work as a unified system toward the same overarching goal -promoting volunteerism across the state- which is the mission of the **Corporation for National and Community Service, Volunteer Tennessee and AmeriCorps Alums**.

## *Cross-Streaming in Action: AmeriCorps Alums*

**AmeriCorps Alums** is a stand-alone operating unit within [Points of Light Institute](#) — an organization that inspires, equips and mobilizes people to take action that changes the world. The [Tennessee AmeriCorps Alums](#) chapter partners with [Hands On Nashville](#) who acts as the chapter's Fiscal Agent.



AmeriCorps Alums is a community of experienced volunteer leaders who share a commitment to a vision of a more perfect America. We are a national network of over **half a million alumni** from the AmeriCorps national service (including NCCC, VISTA and AmeriCorps VISTA).

As the premiere national service alumni organization, AmeriCorps Alums is uniquely positioned to be on the cutting edge of the civic leadership community. Our vision is that the lifetime engagement of alumni is a transformational force for change in America's communities.

## 2011 - 2015 Strategic Plan

### Background

On April 21, 2009, President Obama signed the Edward M. Kennedy Serve America Act (SAA), the most sweeping expansion of national service in a generation. This landmark law is making America stronger by focusing service on key national issues; expanding opportunities to serve; building the capacity of individuals, nonprofits, and communities to succeed; and encouraging innovative approaches to solving problems.

Fulfilling the promise of the Act has been the top priority of the Corporation for National and Community Service, the federal agency that leads the nation's service and voluntary sector. One year after its enactment, volunteering is up, momentum is strong, and a new vision for service is taking effect, one based on growth, innovation, and targeting resources on our nation's pressing problems.

### Five-Year Strategic Plan

Every five years, Congress requests each federal agency to adopt a strategic plan that defines its missions, goals, and the means by which it will measure its progress. The Serve America Act is helping to shape the Corporation's Strategic.

### Plan for the Next Five Years

Given the breadth of the social impact focus areas that are outlined in SAA, the Corporation has many opportunities to make significant progress in addressing issues of critical concern to the nation. We began the strategic plan planning process by defining our Key Objectives, which summarize the Corporation's impact that we intend to accomplish over the next five years. We concentrated on getting to "the root of the problem" while ensuring that we kept our Key Objectives broad enough to address national challenges and needs. In addition, we sought to include Key Objectives that would be aligned with our strategic priorities, as outlined by our CEO, Patrick Corvington. These priorities include:

- Service as a Solution
- Expanding Opportunities to Serve
- Build Enduring Capacity
- Embrace Innovation

Interviews with industry experts and thought leaders in the field were extremely helpful in assisting our staff in honing in on those Key Objectives that present the most strategic opportunities in addressing the focus areas outlined in the SAA. In addition, we explored key objectives that would allow us to deploy "place-based strategies" and address multiple federal agencies and initiatives. Finally, the Key Objectives should be informed by our past work, hold relevance in the years ahead, and enable facilitation of community members serving their communities.

## The Key Objectives

In light of these criteria and conversations with industry experts, thought leaders and stakeholders, we are proposing the following themes for the Key Objectives:

Once the Key Objectives are finalized, the staff will propose a set of metrics and indicators to provide additional specificity that will be used by the board and the CEO to monitor the Corporation's performance. The result will be a "chain of outcomes" that directly links the work of grantees, partners and service participants to the Key Objectives. We are on a collective journey and together, we can provide opportunities for people to serve in a meaningful way. We genuinely want to hear from you.

The Corporation wants and encourages both current and potential new partners and grantees to provide input and feedback on our strategic plan. Opportunities for you to provide feedback include the following:

- Face-to-face Community Dialogues with our CEO and Board of Directors
- Numerous webinars for the general public
- On-line message board

The feedback and input from our Community Dialogues, webinars, and message board will be synthesized and shared with everyone whom we have on record as participating. In addition, a summary report will be posted on our website and disseminated broadly through our various listservs and other communication mechanisms.

Finally, the Strategic Plan itself will be posted on our website in the fall of 2010 and we will share the plan widely to ensure that you have a chance to examine the plan that you helped to create!

# National Service Days Perfect for Cross-Streaming!

## Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day of Service

Fueled by President Obama's call to service, the 2010 King Day of Service experienced a historic level of participation, as Americans across the country honored Dr. King by serving their communities. In total, more than 13,000 projects took place, more than doubling last year's record of 5,000 projects. This historic turnout is the largest ever in the 14 years since Congress encouraged Americans to observe the King Holiday as a national day of service and charged the Corporation for National and Community Service with leading this national effort.

Americans in all 50 states made it a "a day on, not a day off" by delivering meals, refurbishing schools, reading to children, signing up mentors, planting trees, and much, much more. Given the huge increase in projects and the countless number of self-organized or spontaneous efforts it is difficult to estimate total volunteers, but participation is likely to have surpassed the one million mark, double last year's turnout. While 2010 King Day is passed, our work has just begun. Fulfilling Dr. King's dream and making America "what it ought to be" will take a large-scale, long-term commitment. Tennessee was recently ranked 32<sup>nd</sup> in the nation in terms of its volunteer rate (*Volunteering in America: 2010*), but recognizing volunteers can help us do better. Volunteers are critical in making positive changes at the local level and expanding the capacity of non-profits to address local community needs. Volunteering can improve the health of volunteers (*The Health Benefits of Volunteering: A Review of Recent Research*).

Volunteer Tennessee organizes and implements the Governor's Volunteer Stars Awards in consultation with the Governor's office. Volunteer Tennessee staff work with county mayors and county coordinators to establish a selection process at the local level. County selection process should be open and fair, allowing for a variety of volunteers to be nominated and considered.

### **AmeriCorps NCCC**

AmeriCorps NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps) is a full-time, team-based residential program for men and women age 18–24. Members are assigned to one of five campuses, located in Denver, Colorado; Sacramento, California; Perry Point, Maryland; Vicksburg, Mississippi; and Vinton, Iowa.

The mission of AmeriCorps NCCC is to strengthen communities and develop leaders through direct, team-based national and community service. In partnership with non-profits—secular and faith based, local municipalities, state governments, federal government, national or state parks, Indian Tribes and schools members complete service projects throughout the region they are assigned.

Drawn from the successful models of the Civilian Conservation Corps of the 1930s and the U.S. military, AmeriCorps NCCC is built on the belief that civic responsibility is an inherent duty of all citizens and that national service programs work effectively with local communities to address pressing needs. <http://www.americorps.gov/about/programs/nccc.asp>

### ***School-Based Service-Learning***

Volunteer Tennessee currently oversees a Learn and Serve School-Based grant funded through the Tennessee Department of Education and Learn and Serve America. This grant is managed by Volunteer Tennessee and provides service-learning funds to school districts across the state. Students in these school districts lead ever-changing projects connected to their curriculum all year and are always researching **community needs**. Their grant specifies one health and nutrition project per year and one project for Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day.

### ***Community-Based Service-Learning***

Seasons of Service Grant - Volunteer Tennessee will mobilizes several of TN's largest youth organizations – Bridges-PeaceJam, 4-H, and YMCA – to engage 11,150 students in out of school service programs to effectively turn the tides against school attrition. This grant will create a replicable out of school service-learning framework that will fit within the structures of these partners so that they can be institutionalized nationwide.
