### **Cumberland Medical Center - (Crossville, Cumberland County) - Project No. CN0901-001**

The establishment of a twelve (12)-bed inpatient rehabilitation unit and the initiation of rehabilitation services. The twelve (12)-bed unit will result from the conversion of five (5) existing medical/surgical beds and the addition of seven (7) new hospital beds increasing the licensed bed count from 182 to 189.
