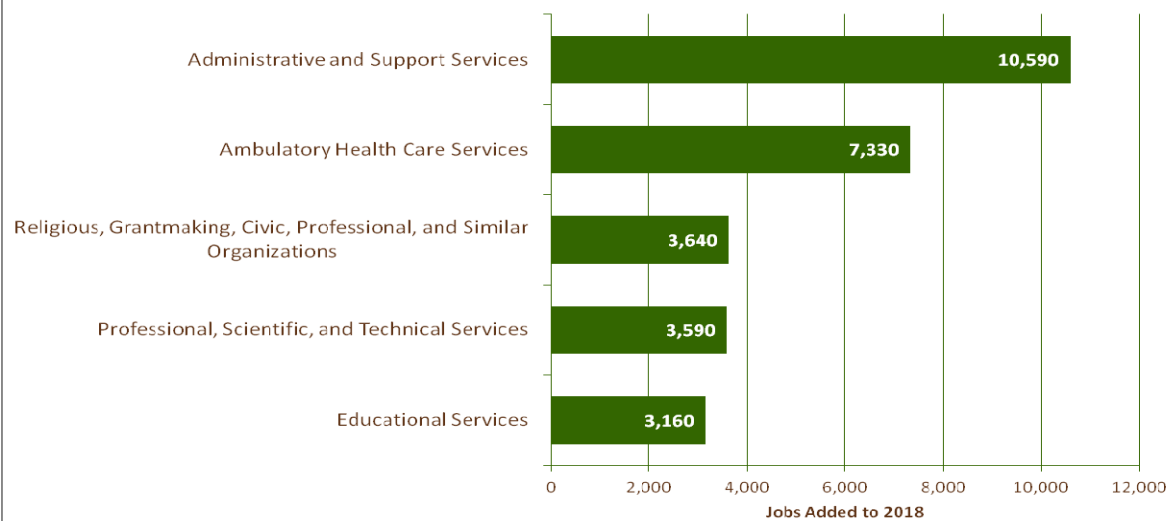

The information on average pay was taken from the Occupational Employment Survey that Tennessee conducts twice each year.

The chart below lists the five industries that are expected to see the greatest amount of growth through 2018 in this part of the state. 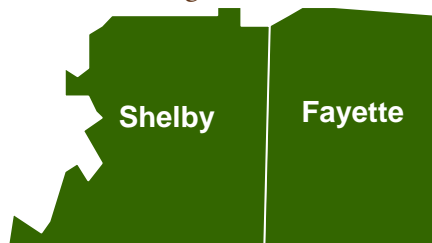
