I have downloaded the Academic Education Form from the Board's website and forwarded it to the Dean (or designee) of my undergraduate school for completion and submission.

I have downloaded the Certificate of Dean of Law School from the Board's website and forwarded it to the Dean (or designee) of my law school for completion and submission.

I understand that if I have not made my request for the background check to the NCBE according to the Tennessee Board of Law Examiners' deadlines, my application to take the Tennessee bar examination may be rejected.

I understand that submitting my application to the NCBE at the last minute may result in a delay in licensing upon successful completion of the Tennessee bar examination.

I understand that filing only with the NCBE does not constitute filing with the Tennessee Board of Law Examiners and vice versa.

I understand that taking and passing the MPRE with a scaled score of 75 within two years of sitting for the Tennessee exam for the first time is a licensing requirement and I have either had my score submitted to Tennessee or I have registered for the next available MPRE exam.
