Tennessee, Vanderbilt University, the Nashville
School of Law and all ABA-approved law schools.
A distinction will no longer be made between
residents and non-residents. Also, those who
received their law degree from a school outside the
U.S.

NOTICE REGARDING MPRE REQUIREMENT

**All first-time applicants for the Tennessee bar examination are required to achieve a scaled
score of 75 on the MPRE within two (2) years of the first Tennessee bar exam actually
taken. No Temporary Certificate of Eligibility or license to practice law will be issued to
any successful examinee unless that examinee has fulfilled all requirements for licensing,
including the MPRE requirement.**
