AN ACT To designate a certain segment of U.S. Highway 412 in Henderson County as the "McCall Lewis Highway".

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the following segment of U.S. Highway 412 in Henderson County is hereby designated as the "McCall Lewis Highway": beginning at the eastern corporate boundary of the City of Lexington eastward to a point one-half (1/2) mile east of the intersection of such highway and State Route 114.

SECTION 2. The Department of Transportation is directed to erect suitable signs or to affix suitable markers designating such segment of U.S. Highway 412 in Henderson County as the "McCall Lewis Highway".

SECTION 3. The erection of such signs or markers shall be within the guidelines prescribed by the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

SECTION 4. The Department of Transportation shall not erect the signs provided for by this act until the local government having jurisdiction over the location of the signs pays to the department a fee equal to the amount necessary to defray the expense of the signs, as determined by the department.

SECTION 5. If the signs provided for hereunder are to be located on a road other than a road designated as an interstate highway, the local government having jurisdiction over the location of the signs may, in lieu of paying the fee required by Section 4, supply to the Department of Transportation the signs provided for in this act. Any signs supplied by local government must be manufactured in accordance with standards established by the Department of Transportation, including, but not limited to, the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

SECTION 6. This act shall become operative only if the Federal Highway Administrator advises the Commissioner of Transportation in writing that the provisions of this act shall not render Tennessee in violation of federal laws and regulations and subject to penalties prescribed therein.


SECTION 7. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.
