HOUSE BILL NO. 1950

AN ACT to amend Chapter 77 of the Private Acts of 1913 (First Extraordinary Session); as amended in its entirety by Chapter 253 of the Private Acts of 1978; Chapter 63 of the Private Acts of 1983; Chapter 69 of the Private Acts of 1987; Chapter 125 of the Private Acts of 1991 and Chapter 58 of the Private Acts of 1997; and any other acts amendatory thereto, relative to the Charter of the City of Humboldt.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Chapter 77 of the Private Acts of 1913 (First Extraordinary Session), as amended in its entirety by Chapter 253 of the Private Acts of 1978, Chapter 63 of the Private Acts of 1983, Chapter 69 of the Private Acts of 1987, Chapter 125 of the Private Acts of 1991 and Chapter 58 of the Private Acts of 1997; and any other acts amendatory thereto, is amended in Chapter 3, Section 16 by deleting subsection (a) in its entirety and substituting instead the following:

(a) Mayor—The Mayor of the City of Humboldt shall be paid a salary of fifty-five thousand dollars (\$55,000) per year, with an increase of three percent (3%) per annum, to be paid in twelve (12) equal monthly installments. This salary increase shall apply to the Mayor next elected following the effective date of this act.

SECTION 2. Nothing in this act shall be construed as having the effect of altering the salary of any incumbent prior to the end of the term for which such public officer was elected.

SECTION 3. This act shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Legislative Body of the City of Humboldt. Its approval or nonapproval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the Legislative Body of the City of Humboldt and certified to the Secretary of State.


SECTION 4. For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this act, it shall be effective upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes, it shall become effective as provided in Section 3.
