AN ACT To amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 62, Chapter 3, Part 1, relative to barbers.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 62-3-101(b), is amended by deleting the first sentence in its entirety, and by substituting instead the following sentence:

Inspections of barber shops shall be performed by inspectors provided and supervised by the director of the board of barber examiners.

SECTION 2. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 62-3-115(3), is amended by deleting the subdivision in its entirety and by substituting instead the following language:

(3) Has held an MOS (military occupational skill) rating in a branch of the military service for two (2) or more years that required the person to perform the duties of a barber.

SECTION 3. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 62-3-124(b), is amended by deleting the language "twenty-four (24)" and by substituting instead the language "sixteen (16)".

SECTION 4. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 62-3-129(b), is amended by deleting subdivision (1) in its entirety and by substituting instead the following language:

(1) All certificates of registration for master barbers and barber instructors shall expire annually on the anniversary of the original date of licensure.

SECTION 5. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 62-3-129(b), is further amended by deleting subdivision (2) in its entirety and by substituting instead the following language:

(2) All certificates of registration for barber shops shall expire annually on the anniversary of the original date of licensure.

SECTION 6. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 62-3-129(c), is amended by deleting the language "five (5) years" wherever such language appears and by substituting instead the language "three (3) years".


SECTION 7. This act shall take effect July 1, 2001, the public welfare requiring it.
