AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-104-112, relative to the sale of fireworks.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-104-112(a)(4)(A), is amended by deleting the language "two hundred thousand (200,000), according to the 1980 federal census" and by substituting instead the language "three hundred thirty-five thousand (335,000), according to the 2010 federal census".

SECTION 2. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-104-112(a)(4)(A)(i), is amended by deleting the language "in excess of two hundred thousand (200,000) or more, according to the 1990 federal census" each time that it appears in subdivision (a)(4)(A)(i) and by substituting instead the language "in excess of three hundred thirty-five thousand (335,000), according to the 2010 federal census".

SECTION 3. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-104-112(a)(4), is amended by deleting subdivision (B) in its entirety.

SECTION 4. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-104-112(a)(4)(A), is amended by deleting the following language:

except in municipalities within such counties with a population of not less than six hundred (600) nor more than six hundred twenty (620), according to such census, that permitted the sale of such fireworks before 1984

and by substituting instead the following:

except in municipalities within such counties with a population of not less than six hundred (600) nor more than six hundred twenty (620), according to the 1980 federal census or any subsequent census, that permitted the sale of such fireworks before 1984

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.


