AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 4, relative to state government.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-29-235(a), is amended by adding the following language as a new, appropriately designated subdivision:

() Doe Mountain recreation authority, created by § 11-27-103;

SECTION 2. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-29-235(a), is further amended by adding the following language as a new, appropriately designated subdivision:

() Board of appeals for the department of human resources, created by § 8-30-108;

SECTION 3. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-29-237(a), is amended by deleting subdivision (7) in its entirety.

SECTION 4. Notwithstanding § 4-29-112 or any other law to the contrary, the civil service commission, created by § 8-30-102, shall terminate and shall cease to exist upon the effective date of this act, as provided in Section 5.

SECTION 5. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-3-1013, is amended by deleting subsection (f) in its entirety and by substituting instead the following:

(f) The TennCare bureau shall be required to annually report to the house health and human resources committee and the senate health and welfare committee concerning pharmacy benefits under the medical assistance program provided pursuant to title 71, chapter 5, on or before January 15th of each calendar year, beginning on January 15, 2013. The report shall specifically report on the use and cost of opioids and other controlled substances in the program.

SECTION 6. Section 1 of this act shall take effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. All other sections of this act shall take effect April 1, 2013, the public welfare requiring it.


