A RESOLUTION to honor and commend Head Coach George Quarles and the 2010 Maryville High School football team for winning the Class 6A State Championship game.

WHEREAS, it is fitting that the members of this General Assembly should salute those student athletes who, through their extraordinary efforts, have distinguished themselves as true sportsmen of whom all can be proud; and

WHEREAS, the members of the 2010 Maryville High School football team have proven themselves to be the ablest of competitors and, as such, deserving of the highest regard; and

WHEREAS, over the course of the last decade, the Maryville Rebels have dominated the high school football ranks and counted among its members some of the most talented young athletes Tennessee has ever produced; and

WHEREAS, under the leadership of legendary Head Coach George Quarles, the 2010 team propelled itself with a 14-1 record to its second-ever Class 6A state championship game in the BlueCross Bowl, playing against Smyrna High School, who entered the game with a 13-2 record. Though Smyrna trailed by only two points in the fourth quarter, Maryville secured its first-ever 6A championship win, ending the game 23-21 and adding a twelfth state championship victory to the school's record; and

WHEREAS, Maryville starting quarterback Patton Robinette was forced to leave the game at halftime as the result of a concussion, but replacement quarterback Austin Canfield helped finish the game in what Coach Quarles said was "a great team win. We were confident in Austin and all our guys were behind him. I thought he made some nice throws and we had some great blocking up front for those runs at the end of the game"; and

WHEREAS, the defensive Most Valuable Player award went to Maryville junior Joseph Watson; and

WHEREAS, Coach Quarles's leadership and passion for the game are without question, and his principles of playing tenacious defense, controlling the ball on offense, and limiting mistakes, were on display during the Rebels' season; and


