A RESOLUTION to congratulate Robert Eugene Ferguson upon being named the Westmoreland Citizen of the Year.

WHEREAS, it is fitting that the members of this General Assembly salute those citizens who, through their remarkable efforts, have distinguished themselves as community leaders of whom we can all be proud; and

WHEREAS, one such estimable individual is Robert Eugene "Gene" Ferguson, who was recently named the Westmoreland Citizen of the Year; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Ferguson is an astute and dedicated community leader who has earned the respect of his peers and the citizens he serves for the exemplary quality of his work; and

WHEREAS, a native of West Virginia, Gene Ferguson graduated from Spanishburg High School before attending Concord College, which is now Concord University; and

WHEREAS, in 1979, Gene Ferguson was hired to teach mathematics at Hendersonville High School, where he taught for six years, during which time he pursued a master's degree at Tennessee State University, served as a referee for church softball and baseball leagues, served on his church board, and was the manager of the Maples Swim Club; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Ferguson accepted the position of vice principal of Westmoreland High School in 1985 and, for the past twenty-six years, has committed himself to performing his duties with excellence and unwavering dedication, qualities he also brought to the role of Westmorelands' athletic director; and

WHEREAS, his professional accomplishments aside, Gene Ferguson is an active and devout member of Roberts Tabernacle Church; and

WHEREAS, he has served as an amateur radio operator for many years and enjoys guns and cats; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Ferguson is also deeply devoted to his family, and he always endeavors to remain true to family values of the highest order; and

WHEREAS, he is most proud of the love and companionship he shares with his wife, Brenda, and he is the proud father of three daughters; and

WHEREAS, the greater Westmoreland community and the State of Tennessee are undoubtedly better places to live because of the life and service of Gene Ferguson; and
