WHEREAS, Dr. Paul Reed was an exemplary public servant and consummate professional who worked assiduously to improve the quality of life for his fellow citizens in numerous capacities; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Reed served with acumen and alacrity as a physician in Hancock County for nearly three decades, in which position he earned the respect of his peers and his patients alike for the exemplary quality of his work; and

WHEREAS, a lifelong resident of Hancock County, Paul Reed was a graduate of Hancock County High School, East Tennessee State University, and the University of Tennessee College of Medicine; and

WHEREAS, active in the civic and political affairs of his community, Dr. Reed ably served as a Hancock County Commissioner and stood as the Vice Chairman of the Hancock County Republican Party; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Reed was an active and devout member of Sneedville First Baptist Church, which he served faithfully for many years; and

WHEREAS, Paul Reed was also deeply devoted to his family, and he always endeavored to remain true to family values of the highest order; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Reed enjoyed the loving companionship of his wife of more than forty years, Paulette Graham Reed, was the proud father of four children, and was the doting grandfather of five grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that this General Assembly should pause to remember the bountiful life of this exceptional public servant and human being; now, therefore,


