A RESOLUTION relative to the Arzo Carson TBI State Office Building.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE SENATE CONCURRING, that the name "Arzo Carson TBI State Office Building" with the official TBI Seal and its adopted motto words of performance: "That Guilt Shall Not Escape Nor Innocence Suffer," have been installed and become a permanent part of the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation and its headquarters building now located at 901 R.S. Gass Boulevard, Nashville, Tennessee, as authorized by Chapter 449 of the Public Acts of 2009.


