WHEREAS, Bri'Anna's noteworthy achievement is a tremendous source of pride for her family, her school, and her community; and


WHEREAS, Bri'Anna Tate's dedication to excellence is clearly deserving of the respect, admiration, and commendation of this legislative body; now, therefore,
