WHEREAS, a gifted and dedicated nurse, Mimi Johnson rendered compassionate care to the sick and suffering at St. Joseph's Hospital, the Internal Revenue Service, and St. Francis Hospital, fulfilling each of her professional obligations as a health care professional with acumen, integrity, and empathy; and


WHEREAS, we wish to grasp this golden opportunity to specially recognize one of Tennessee's most outstanding citizens on this very special occasion; now, therefore,
