WHEREAS, Marcus Houston then returned home to Pulaski to work with the team at Community Bank, now First Farmers and Merchants Bank, where he currently serves as Giles County Senior Banking Executive; and

WHEREAS, seeking to make his community an even better place to live and work, Mr. Houston is a dedicated civic leader who has distinguished himself as a public-spirited citizen of the highest order through his work with numerous boards and organizations, including serving as President of the Pulaski Housing Authority, President of Giles County Habitat For Humanity, Executive Board Member and former Treasurer of the Boys & Girls Club of Pulaski, Board Member of the Child Development Center, Executive Board Member of Pulaski Electric, Industrial Development Board Member, Senior Citizens Center Member, Hope Alive, Inc. Board Member, and Chairman of the Giles County Charter Revision Committee; and


