WHEREAS, throughout the 2011 legislative session, Thuy Pham has surpassed all criteria that define a devoted and conscientious Legislative Intern; and


WHEREAS, Thuy Pham has performed her many duties with extraordinary insight and rare decorum; now, therefore,
