WHEREAS, she relocated to Chattanooga in 1944 with her loving husband, Henry McDowell, and soon joined Warren Chapel AME Church, where she served as president of the Stewardess Board, member and secretary of the Sunday school program, and member of the Missionary Society and the "As Much" Good Neighbor Club; she also devoted much of her time to visiting the sick and shut-ins; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. McDowell never forgot her early life working on the family farm in rural Alabama, and this experience cultivated in her a strong compassion for her fellow citizens, who may not have access to services and amenities afforded to the more advantaged; and

WHEREAS, at the ripe age of ninety-seven, Abbie McDowell remains active in her community, specifically the Missionary Society, Mothers Board, Sunday School, Sunday Worship Service, Noon and Senior Bible Study, and many other worship services; and

WHEREAS, a champion of Christian love and charity, she has always declared herself an instrument of God's peace and will faithfully continue on her path of service and devotion; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. McDowell epitomizes the spirit and commitment that are characteristic of a true Tennessean; and


