WHEREAS, Mr. Timp feels that Beth and her illness are a gift that has exposed him to agape love and the constant presence of God in his life, and his motivational message, In All Her Silence, has helped thousands of people gain a new perspective on life; and

WHEREAS, In All Her Silence delivers a powerful message, as Mr. Timp reveals how through her drive to overcome daunting obstacles, Beth has become the power behind her family's successes; and

WHEREAS, a shining example of Christian character, Mr. Timp serves as an elder at Central Presbyterian Church of Bristol and led the 2011 Habitat for Humanity partnership initiated by his congregation; and

WHEREAS, this remarkable gentleman has rendered astute service as the board president of the Bristol Family YMCA and provided inspirational leadership to the organization;

WHEREAS, a man who has taught his family Christian values with a peaceful heart, Mr. Timp was recently nominated for a Leader in Christian Service Award; and


