A RESOLUTION to honor the memory of William D. Domico of Memphis, Tennessee.

WHEREAS, the members of this General Assembly were greatly saddened to learn of the passing of William D. Domico, an esteemed member of the Bar and a founding partner of Domico Kyle, PLLC, in Memphis; and

WHEREAS, Bill Domico was an exemplary public servant and consummate professional who worked assiduously to improve the quality of life for his fellow citizens in numerous capacities; and

WHEREAS, respected and admired by his clients and his peers in the legal community, Mr. Domico was an exemplary trial attorney whose legal expertise and practice areas included medical malpractice defense, medical product liability, nursing home defense, and environmental law; and

WHEREAS, a graduate of Tulane University, Bill Domico received both his Bachelor of Science degree and his Master of Science degree from that esteemed institution before obtaining a Doctor of Audiology from Florida State University in 1981; and

WHEREAS, Bill Domico received his Juris Doctorate from the University of Memphis in 1989 and was admitted to the Bar in Tennessee that same year; in 1991, he was admitted to practice before the U.S. District Courts of Tennessee and Arkansas, and the U.S. Court of Appeals, Sixth Circuit Court; and

WHEREAS, a certified Medical Malpractice Specialist by the Tennessee Commission on Continuing Legal Education and Specialization, Mr. Domico was a member of the Memphis Bar Association, the Tennessee Bar Association, the Defense Research Institute, the Tennessee Defense Lawyers Association, the Council on Litigation Management, the Professional Liability Committee, and the Medical Malpractice Subcommittee; and

WHEREAS, Bill Domico was also deeply devoted to his family, and he always endeavored to remain true to family values of the highest order; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Domico enjoyed the loving companionship of his wife, Elizabeth Domico, and was the proud parent of two sons, Patrick Domico, a student at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and Adam Domico, a student at Mississippi State University; and

WHEREAS, William D. Domico leaves behind an indelible legacy of integrity and probity in public life, compassion and loyalty in private life, and diligence and dedication in all his chosen endeavors; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that this General Assembly should pause to remember the bountiful life of this exceptional public servant and human being; now, therefore,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we express our sympathy and offer our condolences to the family of William D. Domico.


