WHEREAS, Stanford Hunt has also served with grace and compassion as the chaplain at Memorial Medical Center's Trauma Unit, working assiduously to provide hope and communicate God's love to staff, patients, and family members as they struggled to find answers during life's hardest moments; and

WHEREAS, as a counselor at the Mississippi Boulevard Christian Church in Memphis, Reverend Hunt lent his considerable wisdom and provided deep insights into the souls of countless citizens through his family and HIV/AIDS counseling ministries; and

WHEREAS, a deeply spiritual man who has used his education and personal faith to better his community, Reverend Hunt has held several distinguished positions in a variety of religious organizations, including serving as the Secretary for the Memphis Baptist Ministerial Association and a valued member of the African-American Pastor's Consortium, National Progressive Baptist Convention, and National Baptist U.S.A., Inc.; and

WHEREAS, throughout his estimable career as a religious leader and humble servant of God, Reverend Hunt has demonstrated the utmost ability and integrity, winning the unbridled respect and admiration of all those fortunate to know him; and

WHEREAS, the members of this legislative body are delighted to honor this committed Christian and dynamic leader; now, therefore,



BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an appropriate copy of this resolution be prepared for presentation with this final clause omitted from such copy.


