AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 39, Chapter 13, Part 1, relative to domestic assault.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 39-13-111(c)(1), is amended by deleting the language "subsection (d)" of this section and by substituting instead the language "subsections (d) and (e)".

SECTION 2. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 39-13-111(c)(2), is amended by deleting the language "thirty (30) days" and by substituting instead the language "thirty (30) consecutive days".

SECTION 3. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 39-13-111(c)(3), is amended by deleting the language "ninety (90) days" and by substituting instead the language "ninety (90) consecutive days".

SECTION 4. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 39-13-111, is amended by adding the following as a new subsection:

(e) A person convicted of a violation under this section shall be required to serve at least the minimum sentence day for day. All persons sentenced under this section shall, in addition to service of at least the minimum sentence, be required to serve the difference between the time actually served and the maximum sentence on supervised probation.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2014, the public welfare requiring it.
