Subject:	Criteria for Placing Youth at Taft Youth Development Center

Application:	All Department of Children's Services Juvenile Justice Employees
Policy Statement:	
All male youth referred to Taft Youth Development Center shall meet specific established criteria for placement.	
Purpose:	
To provided guidelines to ensure only male youth who meet criteria for placement at Taft Youth Development Center are referred and a review is completed to ensure that Taft is the least restrictive environment for placement.	
Procedures:	
A. General age requirement	All male youth placed at Taft Youth Development Center (YDC) must be between the ages of 16 and 19 years old.
B. Specialized treatment programs	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Through a Child and Family Team Meeting (CFTM) DCS Policy 31.7, Building, Preparing and Maintaining Child and Family Team, teams may refer appropriate youth to appropriate Specialized Treatment Programs if such referrals will provide the youth with a greater opportunity for success. 2. Youth may be referred to Taft to meet departmental and facility population management or security needs. 3. In all cases referrals to Taft YDC must be reviewed and accepted by the Classification Coordinator before a youth can be admitted.
C. Eligibility criteria	<p>Youth referred to Taft YDC must be male and meet at least one of the following criteria:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Threat of imminent violence toward person(s), particularly those who have assaulted DCS or contract agency staff. 2. Escape, attempted escape or serious planning of escapes from a Youth Development Center (YDC).

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3. One prior placement at a Youth Development Center. 4. Belligerent or unmanageable behavior. 5. Youth disturbance or major group disturbance. 6. Failing to progress in the program at a regional YDC. 7. Termination from a community residential facility or contract facility does not by itself qualify a youth for placement at Taft Youth Development Center.
D. Transfer	Transfers from other youth development centers to Taft Youth Development Center will be in accordance with DCS Policy <u>12.10, Transfer of Youth Between Youth Development Centers</u> .
E. Waivers	The Commissioner or Executive Director for Residential Operations may waive the established criteria to deal with population management or special treatment issues.
F. Transportation	Following approval, the referring site will arrange transportation for the youth and make all other appropriate arrangements. Transportation will be scheduled so the youth will arrive at Taft on a weekday, prior to noon, whenever possible.
G. Protective Exemptions	<p>The following categories of youth must not be placed at Taft:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Youth with intellectual disabilities; 2. Female youth; and 3. Youth with extreme physical handicaps.
H. Documentation	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The results of the CFTM is entered on the appropriate screens in TFACTS within thirty (30) calendar days from the meeting. 2. Placement information for children/youth in DCS custody is entered on the appropriate screens in TFACTS according to best practice and in a timeframe that allows for the needs of the child/youth being placed. This includes disruptions, move toward permanency, lower level placement or change in resource home. 3. Unless other requirements are specified in this policy for documentation, or events not documented elsewhere, or requiring broader explanation will be documented on the appropriate screens in TFACTS within thirty (30) days from the date of the contact or occurrence.
