



Bunker Gear Cleaning



Step 1:
Brush any loose dirt and debris from gear using a stiff bristle brush.



Step 2:
Prepare wash solution of one cap of Tide and 5 gal of warm water. Never use Bleach.



Step 3:
Brush gear with stiff bristle brush and wash solution.



Step 4:
Spots and stains can be treated by applying a small amount of Tide directly to spot and scrubbing.



Step 5:
Thoroughly rinse gear with clean water.



Step 6:
Hang to dry in a well ventilated area. Do not hang in direct sunlight.

Summary:

Bunker gear should be inspected and cleaned on a regular basis and after each fire.

Do not machine wash bunker gear. The gear can be damaged.

Advanced cleaning (machine washing) must **ONLY** be performed by trained personnel.

Gear can be turned in to Support Services for advanced cleaning.

Any gear contaminated with Bio Hazards will be exchanged and sent out for advanced cleaning.
