

Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) Student Certification: Nonstructural Analysis/ Repair

Description

The exam content aligns to the NATEF task list for Non-Structural Analysis and Damage Repair. This includes the tasks involved in the process of diagnosing and repairing collision damage. Topics covered include preparation; outer body panel repair, replacements, and adjustments; metal finishing and body filling; moveable glass and hardware; metal welding and cutting; and plastics and adhesives. The ASE Student Certification in Nonstructural Analysis/ Repair can be thought of as a first step in building a collection of credentials as a service professional in the automotive industry. With an ASE Student Certification, the students will have demonstrated the knowledge and skills needed for an entry level automotive service technician. The exam content covers topics from *Collision Repair: Non-Structural (6062)*. Topics covered include preparation; outer body panel repair, replacements, and adjustments; metal finishing and body filling; moveable glass and hardware; metal welding and cutting; and plastics and adhesives.

Type of Questions	Multiple choice
Length of Test	The exam should be scheduled for 60 minutes. For those students requiring additional time, the system clock will automatically allow twice the recommended time (120 minutes).
Passing Score	22 questions correct
Price	A single \$30 fee per student, per academic year, allows the student to take any or all tests in a test series twice each year – once in the fall and once in the spring. Fall tests can be designated as a pretest for pre- and post-test score reporting.
