It will improve law enforcement officers' response to and prosecution of domestic violence cases. Topic material will include assessing lethality, law review, victim interviewing, high profile offenders, sexual assault, dual arrest, strangulation, coordinated community response, courtroom testimony, witness intimidation, and much more. This course is FREE to all law enforcement personnel.

STEP #1: Under "Upcoming Classes," locate Domestic Violence, Cookeville and select it

STEP #3: Complete the required fields

STEP #4: You will be sent a confirmation email with your username and password as well as a link to sign in

STEP #5: Sign in via this link or you may also go back to step #1 and sign in that way

STEP #6 Select Register under the right class and log in with your username and password

STEP #7 You are now registered and should receive confirmation on the next page
