Dear Commissioners:

This is your formal, required notification that the Town of Nolensville has adopted the state mandated Code of Ethics by Ordinance #06-18. Final reading and passage of this ordinance was September 7, 2006.

The MTAS version was adopted with the addition of a preamble. The preamble is as follows:

**SECTION 1. Preamble.** The citizens of Nolensville are entitled to have fair, ethical and accountable local government that has earned the public's full confidence for integrity. Furthermore, the effective functioning of democratic government requires that public officials comply with both the letter and spirit of the laws and policies affecting the operations of government; public officials be independent, impartial and fair in their judgment and actions; public office be used for the public good, not for personal gain; and public deliberations and processes be conducted openly, unless legally confidential, in an atmosphere of respect and civility. To this end, the Town of Nolensville Board of Mayor and Aldermen adopts this Code of Ethics for the Town of Nolensville to assure public confidence in the integrity of local government and its effective and fair operation.
