If you are a female hunter 18 years or older and are wanting to learn more about hunting deer with a muzzle-loader, come spend the weekend with like-minded individuals in Humphreys County.

The private farm you will be hunting incorporates a variety of wildlife management practices and totals over 2000 acres of prime deer habitat. A variety of topics such as deer biology, deer management, and hunting ethics will be covered.

You will be required to have the appropriate license. You will either need a Sportsman License or a Type 01 and a Type 011. If you are a nonresident, you will need either a Type 074 or 073. If you were born on or after January 1, 1969 you will also need to have suc-

cessfully completed a Hunter Safety course. Participants will draw from a number of predetermined sites that will have tree stands provided.

The cost is only \$200 which includes your meals and camping, if you wish to camp. Campers must provide their own gear. A list of local hotels will be included with the registration packet.
