

**MENTAL HEALTH  
COURTS**

The **Mental Health Treatment Act of 2022** championed by House Speaker Cameron Sexton established **\$5.5M in recurring funding** to create new Mental Health Courts Across Tennessee. As a result, Tennessee went from **3 mental health courts to 23 today** with the ability to serve clients from **45 counties**. These numbers continue to grow as new judges join the program and more courts are created.

Residential recovery courts include: DC4 in Davidson County serving men and women statewide, Women's Residential Recovery Court in Davidson Co. serving women statewide, Morgan County Residential Recovery Court serving men statewide, and Northeast Tennessee Regional Recovery Center serving men and women in nine northeast TN counties.
