Before the matter was voted on, Mr. Bard Quillman, inquired as to how the 20 % sales taxable sales are counted for retail food store applicants. Matt Scanlan responded that as it pertains to his client (Stepherson Inc.) – the grocery stores reported all of the sales that took place within those stores and

all the sales taxable sales that took place within those stores, and that staff -as far as he knew - has determined the filings from his client to adequate, accurate, and appropriate.

Joshua Stepp spoke to how the staff has been handling the question. First, an affidavit that is completed under oath by applicant where the applicant specifies the entire sales that the sales tax applies to and then separately, only the part of the sales tax that fits into the food ingredient category that is taxed at the lower 5% rate and then a percentage is then done after that. Secondly, the staff also asks for an applicant's past year of tax returns from the Dept. of Revenue and from that staff is able to determine whether or not an applicant meets the 20% requirement.

11. MISC - 1. REQUEST ON BEHALF OF GROCERS - submitted by Matthew J. Scanlan of GSRM Law

Matt Scanlan withdrew the request in light of the announcement re: the order noted above.

Before the Commission is a request for the Commission to delegate its authority to approve retail food store licenses to the Executive Director and direct the Executive Director to issue pre-approval letters to those who have complete and approved applications.

Mr. Scanlan "proposes that the Executive Director of the TABC be given authority to issue all complete, uncontested, and undisputed license applications received by the Commission [and] would request that the Executive Director exercise his or her discretion on whether an application should be referred to the Commission for further inspection." Per the request, "we are very concerned that some completed applications will not make it onto the agenda for the May and June meeting [and] further, waiting until the June meeting for regular approval by the board would not allow those applicants to benefit from the pre-stocking legislation as they would not get their approval until late June." The requestor submits that allowing the Director

to approve the applications would allow the Commission to focus on the applications needing further review.

ORDER OF DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY TO EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR PURSUANT TO T.C.A § 57-3-803

Pursuant to T.C.A. § 57-3-803, the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission hereby delegates to the Executive Director of the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission the authority to (1) conditionally approve retail food store applicants for licensure pursuant to T.C.A. § 57-3-801, et seq.; (2) to issue the corresponding letters of approval pursuant to T.C.A. § 57-3-803, and (3) to issue licenses to such retail food stores on, or effective, July 1, 2016, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Such authority shall be valid solely between April 27, 2016, and July 1, 2016. After July 1, 2016, the authority to approve and/or issue retail food store wine licenses shall be solely the authority of the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission, and not of the Executive Director, unless otherwise ordered by the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission.
- 2. In addition, the Executive Director of the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission shall also be given the authority to determine if cause exists to contest the issuance of the license to a store issued a letter of approval pursuant to T.C.A. § 57-3-803 and to take all necessary measures accordingly pursuant to law.

AGREED ORDER

This cause came before the Commission upon Diageo Americas Supply, Inc. d/b/a George A. Dickel & Co.'s ("Diageo") Petition for a Declaratory Opinion pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 4-5-223 and Tenn. Comp. R. & Regs. 0100-04-.04 regarding the storage of certain alcoholic beverages outside the State of Tennessee by Diageo. The parties agree that the facts of this matter are those facts specified in paragraphs 1 – 2 and 4 – 7 in Diageo's Petition for a Declaratory Opinion (Diageo's Petition), except that a license issued pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 57-2-102 was issued retroactively for the years 2012-2016 to Petitioner.

Based on the agreement between Petitioner and the Commission as evidenced by the signatures of counsel below, the Commission hereby enters the following declaration: "Tenn. Code Ann. § 57-2-104 has no application to the storage of alcoholic beverages by Diageo or any successor-in-interest in the manner described in paragraphs 1-2 and 4-7 of Diageo's Petition, regardless of the quantity stored or the place of storage. Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 4-5-223, this order shall be binding solely between the agency and Diageo or any successor-in-interest on the facts specified in paragraphs 1-2 and 4-7 of Diageo's Petition, provided that the quantity of alcoholic beverages stored outside the state of Tennessee and the location where such alcoholic beverages are stored outside the state of Tennessee shall not affect the validity of this order. Under no circumstances shall this order be construed to have any effect with regards to

any statute other than Tenn. Code Ann. § 57-2-104, as that statute exists at the time of the entering of this order."

It is so ORDERED.
