Coronavirus FAQs—Acceptable Forms of Identification

Q. What types of identification are acceptable to verify age?

A. Persons selling alcoholic beverages must check a valid, government-issued (state, local, national, federally recognized tribe, or foreign government) document that includes the photograph and birthday of the customer. Please note that executive orders tolling the expiration date of some forms of identification have lapsed. Expired forms of identification are not acceptable to verify age.

Q. Who is required to check identification when selling alcohol?

A. Retail package stores, grocery stores and convenience stores must check identification at every transaction unless the purchaser appears to be 50 years of age or older. Any person delivering alcohol to a customer at their home or any other location must check identification of the person receiving the alcohol. Restaurants selling alcohol for carryout must check identification of the person receiving the alcohol.
