Horticultural Internship

The Tennessee Department of Agriculture is seeking a horticultural intern for the spring of 2027 (March 8, 2027 – May 14, 2027). The chosen candidate will work alongside the Ornamental Horticulturalist at the Ellington Agricultural Center to complete projects that benefit the grounds. This internship provides hands-on experience in public garden maintenance, greenhouse operations, and landscape development.

Major Duties:

Grounds Management:

- The chosen candidate will be responsible for the standard duties of working in a public garden.
 - Examples include helping with garden maintenance and development, greenhouse work, nursery management, propagation, tilling, planting, watering, mulching, weeding, and pest management. Assist with day-to-day office operations, including scheduling and correspondence.

Other duties may be assigned as needed.

Education Requirements:

- Applicants must possess a high school diploma and be currently pursuing a degree in Horticulture, Landscape Horticulture, Plant Science, Agriculture, or another related field.
- Recent college graduates, master's students, and doctoral students may apply.
 - Students enrolled in course work that cannot work full time may apply.
- Applicants must be in good academic standing with a GPA of 2.5 or higher.

Essential Knowledge and Required Skills:

- Strong interpersonal, communication, and organizational skills.
- Ability to plan and execute projects with limited supervision or instruction.
- Familiarity with Microsoft Office.
- General knowledge and understanding of horticulture, botany or agriculture systems is preferred.

Comments:

- This is a paid internship.
- Some travel may be required.
- This internship is part of the TDA's central internship program. In addition to regular project work, interns may be expected to participate in internship-specific events and activities that support learning, professional development, department outreach, and program engagement.
- All participants in the Tennessee Department of Agriculture Internship Program are required to complete an improvement project within their assigned division. Interns will identify an opportunity for growth, develop a project outline, and explain the project's intended outcomes and contributions to the Department. At the conclusion of the internship term, participants will present their projects to Executive Leadership during a luncheon.

Working Conditions:

- This position involves work in a public garden and greenhouse environment. The normal work week is Monday through Friday, with hours ranging from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The position will likely also require some weekend hours for watering the greenhouse. Work involves heavy lifting and exposure to heat, humidity, and potential allergens. Employees are expected to maintain a professional appearance and interact directly with the public in a respectful and mature manner.
