Plant Sciences & Entomology Internship

The Tennessee Department of Agriculture (TDA), Division of Consumer and Industry Services (CIS) is seeking an intern for the summer of 2026 (May 18, 2026 – August 14, 2026). The selected candidate will spend time with the Plant Certification program area under CIS. This internship is designed to offer the chosen candidate a full hands-on experience with plant sciences, entomology, and associated regulatory activities performed by the Tennessee Department of Agriculture.

Major Duties by Program Discipline:

Licensing & Inspection:

- Become familiar with Tennessee's phytosanitary regulatory framework, including import and export requirements.
- Assist Plant Certification office staff with reviewing new business applications.
- Shadow inspectors during routine inspections at nurseries, greenhouses, retail locations, and other field locations.

Entomology & Apiary:

- Become familiar with entomological pests that impact plant and honeybee health.
- Shadow the State Entomologist and the State Apiarist while they perform fieldwork, including setting and retrieving traps for insects of concern and insect identification.
- Assist with Spotted Lanternfly monitoring and control efforts in the Davidson County area.

Plant Pathology:

- Learn about regulated plant pathogens and diseases affecting Tennessee's green industry.
- Shadow inspectors during sample collection of suspect plant tissue and observe Plant Pathologist during laboratory sample analysis.
- Assist Plant Pathologist with sample preparation and analysis using techniques such as microscopy, serological assays, and molecular diagnostic methods to identify fungal, bacterial, viral, and nematode pathogens affecting plant health.

Other duties may be assigned based on needs and interests.

Education:

- Applicants must possess a high school diploma and be currently seeking a degree in plant sciences, horticulture, entomology, biology, agriculture, or related area of study.
- Recent college graduates, master's students, and doctoral students may apply.
- Must be in good academic standing with a GPA of 2.5 or higher.

Essential Knowledge and Required Skills:

- Candidates must have a valid driver's license.
- Ideal candidates should have an interest in state regulation and public safety.
- Ideal candidates must have the ability to work independently.
- Familiarity with Microsoft Office is required.
- Ideal candidate must be comfortable making and accepting phone calls.
- General knowledge and understanding of the agriculture industry is preferred but not required.

Comments:

- This is a paid internship.
- Some travel may be required.
- All participants in the Tennessee Department of Agriculture's Internship program are required to present details of their internship experience to executive staff. This presentation will be given to executive leadership during a luncheon at the end of the internship term.
