



Hurricane Helene Response – Report 4

Oct. 4, 2024

Staff Deployed

- 57 Forestry staff, 11 transports, 10 dozers, 1 UTV, 1 skid steer
- 8 Agricultural Crime Unit Officers
- 2 Animal Health staff
- 3 Emergency Services Coordinators

Highlights

- Forestry crews continue to clear roads and rights-of-way in Carter, Johnson, Unicoi, and Washington Counties.
- The Forestry Grand Division Incident Management Team has taken over Forestry-related operations in Carter County.
- A Forestry UTV operator continues to generators for emergency communications in Carter County.
- An additional 10-person chainsaw crew has been ordered to assist with debris removal in Washington County and will be arriving on scene this afternoon.
- TDA is maintaining a list of resources to address livestock needs and continuing to monitor county requests through TEMA.
- Commodities staff are assisting in coordination of food and feeding sites for citizens and first responders in Carter, Cocke, Greene, Unicoi, and Washington Counties.
- TAEP annual enrollment is currently underway. However, staff are working to accommodate affected farmers in Carter, Cocke, Grainger, Greene, Hamblen, Hawkins, Johnson, Unicoi, and Washington Counties* and will allow a second TAEP application period Dec. 2-6 for applicants who live in those counties.

*(*counties align with Governor Lee's request for disaster declarations and public assistance)*
