

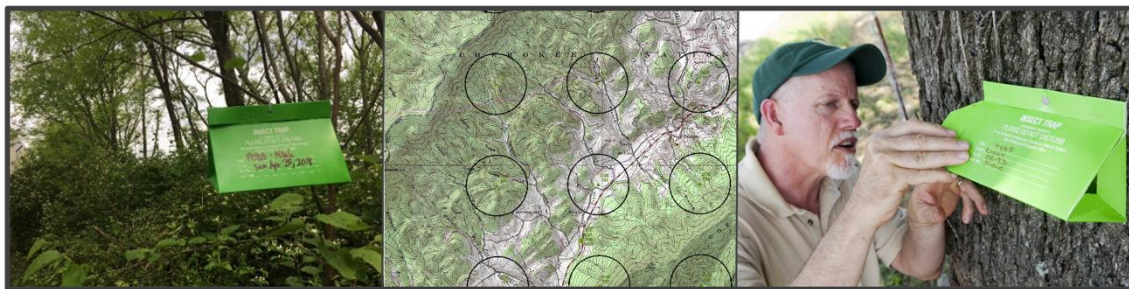
Job Description

Gypsy Moth Trapper – 1 Seasonal Position

Locations: Carter, Johnson, Sullivan, Washington, and Unicoi counties

Salary: \$13/hour

Tennessee Department of Agriculture, Division of Forestry is hiring one trapper to collect and report accurate data about gypsy moth populations in Tennessee counties: Carter, Johnson, Sullivan, Washington, and Unicoi. Job duties include monitoring insect traps with a pheromone lure at pre-determined field locations and reporting trap catch data. The nature of gypsy moth survey work requires that you work independently, be proficient at interpreting topographic maps, and use mobile data collection hardware and software. Training will be provided on how to service traps, as well as, how to collect and record information. Data to be reported includes timesheets, trap data, and travel claim reports for mileage. Trap locations are often in very remote locations, require navigation through rough terrain, and require high physical endurance. As such, previous experience under rigorous field conditions is preferred. Reliable transportation is a prerequisite for the position. Candidates living within assigned counties will be given special consideration.
