PROJECT OVERVIEW

The State of Tennessee has a history of leadership in the national 911 community in areas of technology and management. Tennessee is working to continue that legacy of excellence through our training program. The Tennessee Emergency Communication Board (TECB) is focused on offering 911 training initiatives that ensure District and PSAP leadership and telecommunicators have the knowledge, skills and abilities required to improve emergency response outcomes. These training opportunities are made available through both the online training program, Virtual Academy, and in-person classroom offerings.

WHO IS IMPACTED

Governmental PSAPs that take initial or transferred 911 calls can take advantage of the training opportunities offered online or in-person.

CURRENT STATUS – AUGUST UPDATES


Classroom Training. The classes for July and August will take place and are the final in-person sessions for the year.

VIRTUAL ACADEMY

In March, the TECB recognized two years of providing an online learning platform to the PSAPs in Tennessee. Since then, over 2,175 users have registered for access to the platform.

Coming Soon...

- TECB is working to develop an online course to address the new state law regarding cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) training. The telecommunicator CPR (TCPR) course will be available on November 1, 2020.
- In addition, over the next few months the TECB will be promulgating rules regarding TCPR training that will be required of all public safety dispatchers who receive an initial or transferred 911 call from the public in Tennessee after January 1, 2021.
