<u>Ieff Elliott- Fire Service Program Director – TFACA:</u>

This year we had 67 departments that exceeded a thousand or more contact hours. Congratulate Captain Powell, Johnson City was recognized with 11,062 hours. Murfreesboro was the second career fire department, and Seymour Volunteer Fire Department was recognized as the top volunteer department with 2,900 hours.

On campus we have 19 recruits that are scheduled to graduate November 3rd if all goes well. I will report on some campus improvements: nearly \$3 million that has been spent either in improvements or additional props over the past five years. So if you haven't been to the Academy recently, those figures break down, number one, by just under \$900,000 for a new ladder truck that we received in June. We received a new pumper in December. One of the things that gets attention the most is we are going under contracts to replace all the mattresses, so that's being done as well. Also, the Governor's budget it included \$5.7 million for a conference center, so that has been awarded to a designer, so that is moving forward. Also received approval to meet with a designer for a new residential burn prop, and all the dorms are going through a new air-conditioner upgrade.

And lastly, unfortunately the Tennessee-Virginia NFA weekend was canceled due to staff being utilized at various disasters across the country.

VIII. DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Fox introduced new Fire Commission employees Michael Miranda who will be the Fire Coordinator for the Eastern & Middle Grand Division replacing Richard Rockford, and Brian Nicholson who will be the Fire Coordinator for the Western & Middle Grand Division replacing Steve Cross.

Michael and Brian introduced themselves and talked briefly about their background and how it is an honor to be selected to work with the Tennessee Fire Commission.

a. Report from legal – Joe Underwood

Regarding a complaint received:

We received a complaint in the Firefighting Commission, and I'm presenting to the commission to take action. I believe you've all heard these before. The Commission of Firefighting Personnel Standards and Education, hereafter referred as the Commission, received a complaint from a former firefighter against his former department and chief. The complaint alleges that the firefighters of this department were allowed to take online training, and then encouraged by staff and officers to take online exams and share the correct responses with other students on required training by the department. These courses provided Tennessee fire training online and at FEMA and EMA, such as NIMS required courses. These allegations involve courses that were held in 2015 and 2016, but the complaint was received after the complainant's termination from the Department in 2017. The complainant also alleges that outside instructors were coming to teach classes and would give the final exam and then walk out of the room. And during this time, they would work together to answer the test questions. The allegations cover classes that involve salary supplement. However, the complainant did not receive a salary supplement during the period of time cited in the allegations; those years 2015, 2016.

Interviews with the respondent parties were conducted in the interview involved in the allegations. Instructors of the courses in question were interviewed and the instructors were able to document their training courses and teaching practices. The department, the responding department, also had documents to support their training programs. And all paperwork for instruction and testing appeared to be in compliance during interviews.

The training officer for the department at the time of the allegations is no longer with that department and he did not participate in the interviews. The former training officer did not receive incentive pay for 2016. Due to our interviews and the information we received, there's been no supporting information received or obtained to substantiate the allegations in the complaint, and therefore legal's recommendation to the Commission is to dismiss this complaint.

There is one piece of legislation that did pass. In the waning days of the session, in-the-line-of-duty compensation was increased substantially from a one-time payment of \$25,000 for members of

recognized fire departments to now to be \$50,000 over five years, \$250,000 payment to the estate of a firefighter or first responder who has died in the line of duty. However, the requirement was added that they be up to date in their training and that they be part of a recognized fire department. So these fire departments who are operating -- volunteer fire departments who are not recognized through the state fire marshal office, their members would be ineligible if something happened to them while on duty. So it's very imperative to help get the word out that they would join, become recognized appropriately, and also update their training requirements.

b. IFSAC

We received a letter from IFSAC regarding their approval for our Fire Inspector II level of certification that was sent and considered for accreditation. When the rule goes into effect, we'll be able to work with TFACA, Steven Snow and his crew, and others who may want to submit a Fire Inspector II program to be able to certify that level.

c. Coordinator Status

Introductions of the new Fire Coordinators have already been done.

d. Reciprocity Report – Linda Brown

Just real quick, this is a year-end report and there really isn't a whole lot to discuss except for the fact that the reciprocities are going pretty well. As far as the new rules that we instituted, they're also being followed very well.

DIRECTOR FOX: I'd just like to comment on Ms. Brown's work with reciprocity. She's very professional in what she does. She's very consistent in what she does with the people she interacts with. And that may cause a little confusion out there sometimes for folks, but my guidance to her is, as long as we're consistent in how we treat people and make sure that they all follow the same rules, then I will support her in whatever way I can to help her accomplish this reciprocity action that I've tasked her with. Her being there on a day-to-day basis in the office really streamlines the process for reciprocity. And the amendments that y'all made in the past kind of closed the gates down and narrowed it down to where it's a lot easier to control and deal with.

The next thing I have is the audit reports that were conducted a few weeks ago with Chief Kelley and Chief Naifeh. There were four audits. We conducted audits in Munford, Chief Naifeh and I did. Also, we conducted audits in Milan, Tennessee as well.
