- Identify and prioritize risks
- Show methodology of how these risks were identified and prioritized
- Show what strategies were created to mitigate these risks
- Identify partners and resources needed for program implementation
- Explain how the program's successes and weaknesses will be measured
- If applicable, show examples of how the plan has been monitored, evaluated, or modified
- If applicable, acknowledge strengths and weaknesses of the original plan

Highest scoring applications will be chosen to present at the Tennessee Fire Loss Symposium (TFLS). **All applicants should be prepared to present their CRR Plan at the Fire Loss Symposium in mid-October of 2022.**
