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AGREED FINAL ORDER

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This matter came to be heard on December 13, 2019, before the Honorable Michael Begley, assigned by the Secretary of State, Administrative Procedures Division, sitting on behalf of the Commissioner of Commerce and Insurance. Assistant General Counsel, Robyn L. Ryan, represented the Tennessee Securities and Insurance Division ("Division"). Respondent did not appear, and no one appeared on her behalf.

On Monday, December 16, 2019, Judge Michael Begley received a faxed request for a continuance in the matter that had been faxed the previous Friday, December 13. Respondent was contacted by telephone on Tuesday, December 17, 2019 and agreed to the revocation of her insurance license.

On September 29, 2016, Respondent entered an *Alford* plea to, and was convicted of, the felony offenses of making Terroristic Threats and Criminal Damage to Property in the Second Degree, in the Superior Court of Bibb County, Georgia. Respondent was sentenced to five years probation. Respondent was also ordered to pay restitution to the victim, a fine of \$500.00 dollars, court costs of \$680.00 and attend anger management. Respondent did disclose these convictions on her Tennessee insurance producer licensure renewal submitted on October 17, 2016. However, actions were taken against Respondent's Georgia resident and Louisiana nonresident insurance producer licenses, respectively. The Georgia Department of Insurance's filed an administrative order placing Respondent's Georgia resident license on probation in February 2017, administrative action for as long as she remains under criminal probation. The Louisiana

Louisiana Department of Insurance's final administrative order revoked Respondent's Louisiana nonresident license based on Respondent's criminal conviction. Respondent did not report these actions to the Tennessee Department of Commerce and Insurance Commissioner within thirty (30) days after the final disposition of those matters as required.

The parties agree that Respondent's failure to report the Louisiana and Georgia administrative actions are a violation of TENN. CODE ANN. § 56-6-119(a) which provides:


- (a) A producer shall report to the commissioner any administrative action taken against the producer in another jurisdiction or by another governmental agency in this state within thirty (30) days of the final disposition of the matter. This report shall include a copy of any order entered or other relevant legal

Additionally, Respondent's actions are in violation of Tenn. Code Ann. 56-6-112(a)(2)


(a) The commissioner may place on probation, suspend, revoke, or refuse to issue or renew a license issued under this part or may levy a civil penalty in accordance with this section or take any combination of those actions, for any one (1) or more of the following causes:

- ....  
(2) Violating any law, rule, regulation, subpoena or order of the commissioner or of another state's commissioner;  
....

Based on the foregoing, the parties AGREE that Respondent Theresa Mayer's insurance license number ~~2093427~~ is hereby revoked and it is, therefore, so ORDERED.



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
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ORDER


