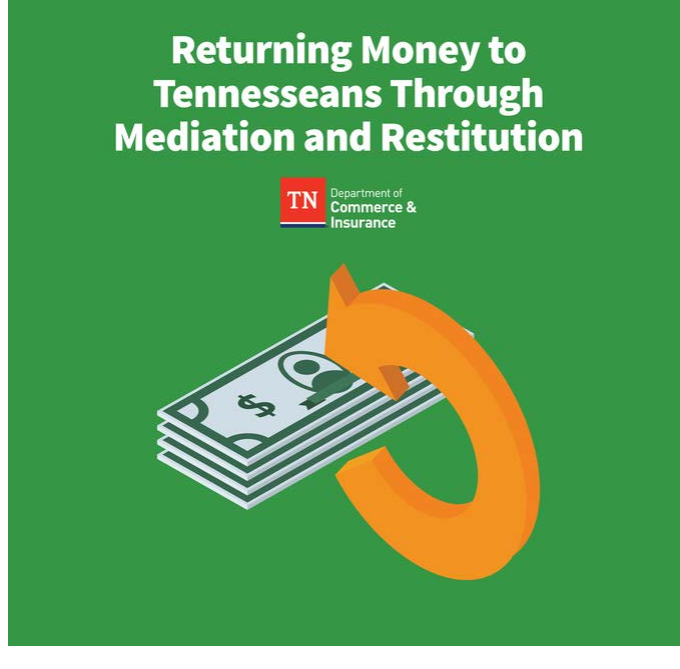
\$7.4M Returned to Tennesseans

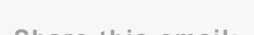
